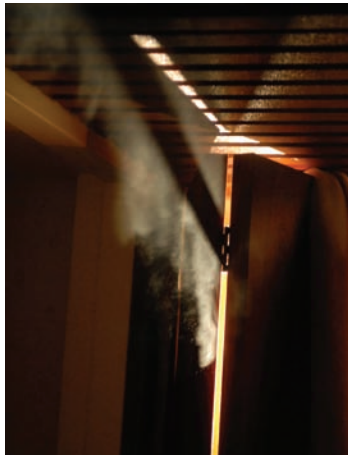
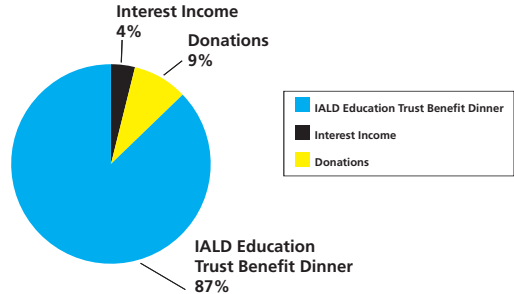

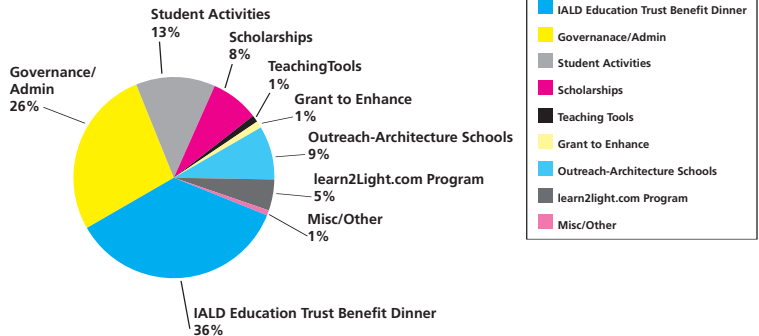

GRANT TO ENHANCE

The IALD Education Trust Grant to Enhance Lighting Design Education was developed to provide the educational continuity of five years of funding, enhancing architectural lighting design education at the university level. The recipient will receive \$50,000 USD over the course of five years, for a total of \$250,000 USD.

The IALD Education Trust announced the recipient of the first Grant to Enhance as the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, College of Engineering, and Dr. Kevin Houser. Project CANDLE, as submitted by the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, is a proposal to "**C**reate an **A**lliance to **N**urture **D**esign in **L**ighting **E**ducation."

Conceived as an industry/university partnership to advance lighting professions, the two principal objectives of project CANDLE are to increase the number of students that make lighting their vocation, and to ensure that coursework and educational experiences are responsive to industry needs such that graduating students have the right set of skills and training for careers in the lighting profession.

These objectives will be achieved through a series of activities:

- Outreach to high school students through the creation of the IALD Student Ambassador Award
- The mentorship of a future lighting educator and the support of a PhD dissertation through the creation of the IALD Future Lighting Educator Fellowship
- An annual lighting industry advisory group roundtable and retreat
- Student travel awards, exposing students to the career opportunities in lighting, encouraging interaction between students and professionals

OUTREACH TO STUDENTS OF ARCHITECTURE

One of the challenges facing the lighting design industry today is the lack of qualified lighting designers coming into the profession. To address this issue, the IALD Education Trust has embarked upon an outreach effort targeting students in architecture programs around the world. This effort will help ensure that design firms have the appropriate workforce resources to be successful.

The outreach program pairs a lighting designer personally with a school of architecture. These designers commit their time, energy and expertise to building lasting supportive relationships with university architecture departments. Designers visit targeted schools and meet with key faculty, give formal presentations to students, make studio visits, and hold informal conversations with students.

To assist the designers who agree to devote their time to this worthy endeavor the Trust has developed a scripted message and a PowerPoint presentation addressing: what is light, what is the professional lighting design process, what is the IALD and what is the IALD Education Trust.

Spearheaded by board member and 2006 & 2007 President Phil Gabriel, FIALD, as of the end of 2007, the IALD Education Trust had agreements to visit 20 universities. Mr. Gabriel is confident that this effort will assist students and university programs as well as the lighting design industry.

THE NEXT GENERATION OF LIGHTING DESIGNERS, learn2light

The IALD Education Trust developed a recruiting campaign capitalizing on social networking and Web 2.0 advancements to entice students into lighting design courses, and hopefully into the lighting design profession. Posters and collateral material have been distributed to universities on an international level, directing those interested to visit the learn2light.com web site.

Launched in October 2007, learn2light.com acts as a portal to various schools offering programs in lighting design.

Upcoming activities will include an increased focus on blogs and social community building, directing students to our information and providing opportunities for communication and discovery.

B-K LIGHTING + TEKA ILLUMINATION ENDOWMENT ESTABLISHED IN 2007

B-K Lighting + Tekal Illumination have established an educational endowment fund, in honor of Mike Shultz, in order to support student participation at Enlighten Americas.

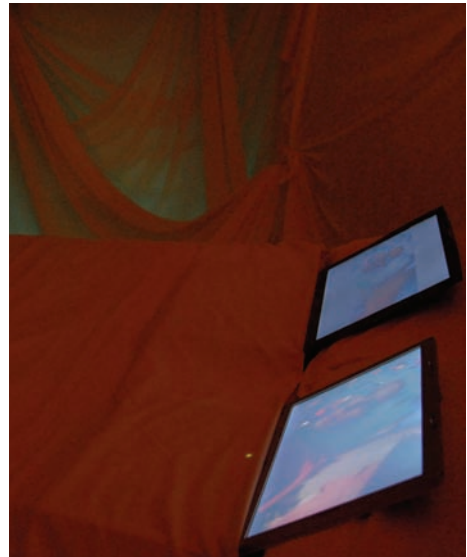
Administered through the IALD Education Trust, B-K Lighting + Tekal Illumination have seeded the self-sustaining endowment with an initial contribution of \$10,000 USD, and will contribute \$10,000 USD each year for five years until the fund reaches \$50,000 USD.

This endowment fund will support the distribution of a \$2,500 USD stipend to support students in attending the annual Enlighten Americas educational conference.
